








Coolgardie Exhibition Museum/Visitor Centre

Originally the Courthouse and Mining Registry, built in 1898, the building is now the Visitor Centre and Museum. Each room tells the story of life in and around Coolgardie during those early years. Stories include the Varischetti Mine Rescue, Waghorn Bottle Collection, Pharmacy Collection and Tin Collection.

Warden Finnerty House & Devonshire Tea

Warden Finnerty's Residence is one of the early buildings built by the Bunnings brothers, whose hardware company became one of Australia's largest retail chains. During a visit you can walk through the rooms, with lovely antique furnishings and chinaware on display, to capture the feeling of life in the late 1890s.

Enjoy Devonshire tea on the verandah while taking in the views.

Coolgardie Cemetery

Take a self-guided tour with a cemetery guide available from the visitor centre. The grave of our better-known ghost, Elizabeth Gold, can be found buried near the resting place of her murderer.

Coolgardie's Glory Days Boom to Bust Trail

This self-drive/walk has 65 markers placed at significant sites around the Coolgardie Community, each with detailed descriptions and old photographs highlighting the historical sites. Let your imagination bring the Coolgardie of yesteryear alive as each marker provides a snapshot of what the town was like in the 1890s.

Ben Prior Park / Open-Air Museum

Featuring interesting items that date back to 1894; the wagons that brought the Sisters of Mercy Nurses to Coolgardie during the Typhoid epidemic, the Steam Engine and equipment used in the 1890s on the mines – even a revolving bottle washing machine! Dedicated to a long-time resident of Coolgardie, the late Mr. Ben Prior collected many of the items on display while living and running the service station next door to the park.

Mystery Road Filming Location Trail

A self-guided tour that visits locations where Mystery Road: Origin (Season 3) was filmed around Coolgardie.

Railway Station

Built in 1896, the Coolgardie Station was known to be one of the busiest stations in WA. Sadly, it closed in 1979. Today's visitors are still able to view the old locomotive and carriages that sit on the tracks.

Then....

Coolgardie's history begins in 1892 when prospectors Arthur Bayley and William Ford discovered gold. Their find, known as Bayley's Reward, sparked a massive gold rush, attracting thousands of fortune-seekers from all over the world.

As news of the gold strike spread, Coolgardie experienced rapid growth. Within a year, the town's population swelled from a few hundred to over 15,000 people, making it the third-largest town in Western Australia at the time.

In November 1892, the government declared Coolgardie an official goldfield, leading to the establishment of a townsite.

To accommodate the influx of people, Coolgardie quickly developed essential infrastructure and services. Hotels, banks, shops, schools, theatres, sporting clubs, dance halls and hospitals were built, transforming the once-barren landscape into a bustling town with a vibrant social life.

One of the most significant challenges in the arid region was a lack of water. To address this issue, engineer C. Y. O'Connor undertook the ambitious project of constructing the Coolgardie Water Pipeline. Completed in 1903, it stretched over 500 kilometers from Perth, providing a reliable water supply to the goldfields, including Coolgardie.

Gold production reached its peak in 1898, with over 700,000 ounces of gold extracted from the area. However, as the gold began to diminish, miners moved on, resulting in a decline in the town's population and economic activity.

Coolgardie has preserved much of its rich heritage. Many historic buildings, including the grand Warden's Court, Warden Finnerty's Residence and the Post Office, have been restored and are open to visitors, providing a glimpse into the town's prosperous past.

Today, Coolgardie continues to attract visitors interested in exploring the region's heritage, experiencing the arid landscape, and learning about the challenges and triumphs of the gold rush pioneers.

Now...

Over 3,600 people live in the Shire and enjoy a relaxed lifestyle complemented by a stunning natural environment. The Shire includes the towns of Coolgardie, Kambalda, Widgiemooltha and the Aboriginal community of Kurrawang.

City of Kalgoorlie Boulder - 30 mins away

Just 38 kilometres away lies our neighbour, the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder, which is home to over 30,000 people in the surrounding region. Its residents enjoy a laid-back lifestyle in a diverse natural environment. Kalgoorlie-Boulder is famous for the gold discovery made in 1893 by Irish prospectors, Paddy Hannan, Tom Flanagan, and Daniel Shea. Today, the city thrives with numerous mining and processing companies operating in the area. The city boasts grand turn-of-the-century architecture and character buildings that add to its unique heritage. As a result of the gold rush in the 1890s, Kalgoorlie-Boulder played a pivotal role in the federation of Australia and is home to the richest square mile of gold in the world.

Start your Goldfields Experience before you arrive!

The Golden Pipeline Trail begins only three-quarters of an hour east of Perth at scenic Mundaring Weir.

The trail is an ideal way to explore the history, hospitality and horizons of Golden Pipeline Country. There's plenty to get you out of your car: 100-year-old pumping stations, remote sites where workers lived to keep the water flowing, walk trails around massive granite outcrops - 25 interpreted sites.
